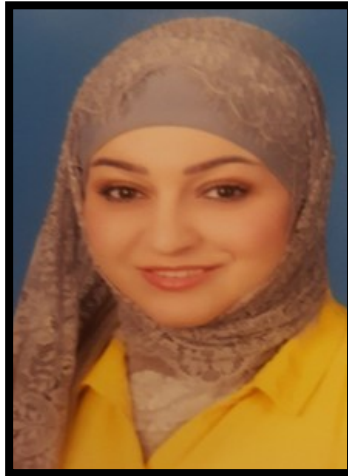
On the sporting front, I am pleased that a larger number of students signed up for our football, basketball and volleyball teams, competing in local tournaments hosted by other schools and universities.
